Dear Parents and Carers,

Ofsted Update

We still await with anticipation our call from Ofsted. In September 2019 Ofsted produced a new framework with which we have to comply. When they come they will be looking at what life is like for children at our school and whether I, together with the rest of the teaching team are raising the standards of the education we deliver.

The inspection report will be much shorter than our previous one, Ofsted have deemed this easier for parents to access. It may come across that the inspectors have not looked very deeply into school life, however I can assure you that they do and will. We are working closely with the Local Authority and also the Headteacher of Eastfield infant school in St Ives to make sure we are ready for inspection.

The new framework reports on the following areas:

The Quality of Education – the most important aspect here is our curriculum and the quality of the delivery. How we cater for children with Special Educational Needs and the most vulnerable pupils. You may already be aware that we have had a complete curriculum overhaul this year and are now teaching a 'Knowledge Curriculum'. This means that we are exposing the children to deeper learning opportunities across all subjects. From learning about the Ice Age in Year 1 to implications of the British Empire in India in Year 5. Our curriculum has been designed to interlink with all subjects so if the class are learning about a certain period of History, they will link this to the art and music of that time too. It has been and continues to be a very exciting journey.

Behaviour and Attitudes – how our children behave in and around school, whether they care for each other and whether the staff nurture and look after them. We use a 'Step On' approach to behaviour which is a therapeutic approach. We have found that this gives every individual the strategies that they need to be well behaved and happy at school. Some children need more than others.

We appreciate this and work with the child and their family. This also focusses on the children's attitudes to learning and whether they want to work hard and display good 'learning behaviours'.

Personal Development – This looks at how we develop the children as citizens of the UK. The opportunities we give them to learn an instrument, take part in a club or become a play leader, be on school council or a 'buddy' for our Reception children. We are also required to cover 'British Values' with the children, which include – Democracy, Respect, Individual Liberty and the Rule of Law. This is something that is also represented in our own values of Respect, Kindness, Honesty and Collaboration.

Leadership and Management – This area will look at how the school is lead and managed at every level. Not just me, as the head, but the Senior Leadership Team, the subject leaders, the Governing Body. How we manage the extra money that comes into school such as Pupil Premium and Sports Premium funding. How decisions are made to ensure the children are getting the best possible education they can and how, collectively we are raising standards of education.

The team and I are so grateful for your support in this journey. We have been expecting the call since November so we are constantly ready for an inspection. We were last inspected, as you may remember in November 2017. In the 2 and a bit years that have passed much work has gone into meeting the targets that we need to. A snap shot of this is below.

As always, please speak to us if you are concerned about your child and we will listen and work with you to find a solution. It is also lovely to have positive feedback too, so if you have had a really good experience at school we would love to know so that we can look to replicate it for other families.



Pre-school Fence
